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- 1. Month of Elul blessed in month of Av; Av provides Elul with necessary potential for service of Teshuvah; G-d's immense love for His people stressed in Av; Revelation of G-d's love in Av provides potential for complete service in Elul.
- 2. Addition of word "Menachem" to name "Av" emphasizes G-d's love in Av; Seven Haftorahs of Comfort read after Tishah beAv clarifies G-d's love in Av as expressed in Torah.
- 3. Performance of Torah and Mitzvos in Galus demonstrates Jews' right to "sit at G-d's table"; Redemption follows Teshuvah immediately.
- 4. Chinuch; importance even to non-Jews; "Day of Education" to be declared before start of school year.
- 5. Salary raise to those involved in education; alleviates financial worries and shows appreciation of efforts.
- 6. Printing of Tanya by Chai Elul in countries in which not yet printed; Corrected list of errors and acronyms.
